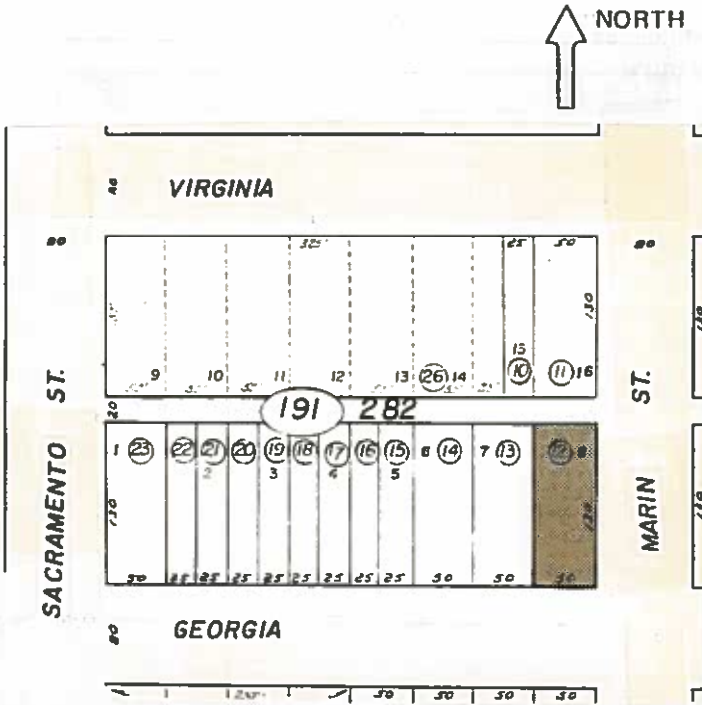

DESCRIPTION

- Briefly describe the present physical appearance of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:
 This simple symmetrical, rusticated stucco building with a classical dentilled cornice above the first floor is the original two-story Odd Fellows Hall, built in 1872. The third and fourth stories, with a classical dentilled cornice at the parapet, and lattice grilles over the third-story storage-room windows, was added in 1922, at which time the original Baroque ornamentation was removed. The tall arched stained-glass windows in the second story are in the impressive, original Lodge Hall.

 There is also a narrow stucco Mission Style building to the rear, facing on Sonoma Blvd. originally two stories tall, dating from the 1890's. This building also had most of its trim and a second-story balcony over Sonoma Boulevard removed when its third and fourth stories were added. The pierced quatrefoil in the original parapet was retained as a third-story window, and the new parapet above the fourth floor roof also has a curvilinear shap similar to the original. SIGNIFICANCE

20. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site when known):

The Odd Fellows Lodge of Vallejo got their first permanent home in 1872, this formerly elaborately-detailed Baroque-style stuccoed brick building. At the turn of the century, First National Bank occupied the ground floor, followed by City of Paris Department store during World War II. Local architect William A. Jones designed the third and fourth floor addition, constructed in 1922. The impressive second-story Lodge Hall remains essentially unchanged.
